Gwinnett OKs tax allocation districts

DULUTH – Five tax allocation districts (TADs) were approved by the Gwinnett County's Board of Commissioners on Oct. 6, the first step in establishing the redevelopment-friendly feature for the Gwinnett Place area.

The Gwinnett Place TAD could more than triple in taxable value from \$178 million to \$607 million in 15 years, depending on the projects realized. It is also estimated that projects in the TAD could create 11,233 jobs and result in \$470 million in annual payroll.
