BILLOWING BLUE. Summertime produces beautiful flowers, such as the hydrangea. The blue billows hydrangea is native to Asia and is grown throughout the world, including the United States. This hydrangea variety has large clusters of papery, light blue flowers and long leaves with rugged edges. Hydrangea means 'water barrel' and refers to the shape of the fruit after it has sprung open, but what it essentially means is that hydrangeas need lots of water.
