## Police Stats -- Crime Decreasing In Gwinnett Place CID Area

Greater Gwinnett Place continues to experience a decrease in overall criminal incidents, according to recently released details.

Representatives of the Gwinnett County Police Department last week briefed the CID's Board of Directors regarding crime statistics for the central business district.

Police-supplied data showed the number of recorded cases in virtually ever category of crime decreased in 2008 from 2007 in the Gwinnett Place CID. Here is a look at some of the figures:

- Commercial burglary - **down 35%**
- Automobile break-ins - **down 27%**
- Traffic accidents - **down 26%**
- Crimes against persons - **down 16%**
- Motor vehicle thefts - **down 6%**

During the same recording period, the police's central precinct (which includes the CID) saw a nearly 11% increase in total patrol activity and a slightly more than 8% increase in criminal arrests independent of traffic citations.

Increased police presence through general patrols and targeted efforts played a leading role in curtailing crime. The CID has greatly increased its partnership with the central precinct to better alert law enforcement to potential issues.

Additionally, the CID routinely conducts community patrols to remove trash, illegal signs and other unsightly debris while also coordinating regular mowing and landscape upkeep throughout the District. These activities assist in deterring unwanted behavior.
