The coalition supports a referendum-based effort to generate funding to relieve congestion, ensure our air quality and promote economic development.

We feel strongly that proactive steps must be taken now to create a sustainable transportation funding system. Such a system should maintain our current transportation investments, help alleviate the current shortfall in transportation funding and allow for strategic expansion and enhancement of projects of a variety of modes.
