The Gwinnett Place Community Improvement District (CID) today officially unveiled images showing what drivers will see as they approach the reconstructed Pleasant Hill Road bridge.

The renderings feature a dynamic and aesthetically pleasing treatment to the fence work that will line the bridge as the diverging diamond interchange (DDI) is installed beginning early next

A 16-member project steering committee developed the bridge's new appearance. Over multiple months of meetings and charrettes, diverse opinions were gathered from international communities, area business owners, residents, county government staff, CID board members, planning consultants, Chamber of Commerce representatives and City of Duluth officials.

CID Chairman Leo Wiener said special lighting, colors and landscaping will increase pedestrian and driver access while branding the bridge as the gateway entrance to greater Gwinnett Place
