**Board Members Elected to Lead
Gwinnett Place CID Efforts**

(Gwinnett) -- The annual elections were held Wednesday for the Board members of the Gwinnett Place Community Improvement District at its regular monthly meeting.

Jill Edwards, a Business Banking Manager for Wells Fargo, was unanimously elected to Post 6. She has been active with the Atlanta Chamber of Commerce for 14 years.
