Gwinnett Place CID partnering with Signal to provide 24/7 security patrols

People who live or work in, or just visit, the Gwinnett Place area will notice some new security vehicles patrolling the area.

That's because the [Gwinnett Place Community Improvement District](#) recently launched a partnership with security firm Signal to have 24/7 public safety patrols around the CID. The uniformed security officers, who will be called Gwinnett Place Ambassadors, will coordinate efforts with Gwinnett County Police to keep the area often referred to as "Gwinnett's central business district" safe from criminals.

Signal's patrols will coincide with the weekday patrols that are already conducted by Gwinnett Place CID staff, offering an enhanced level of security in the area anchored by the former Gwinnett Place Mall.

“Our partnership with Signal enhances our public safety presence and allows us to offer continuous coverage throughout the district,” Gwinnett Place CID Board of Directors Chairman Trey Ragsdale said. “Combined with our existing CID staff patrols, we now have dedicated personnel in the district 24/7, creating a safer and even more welcoming community.”

The addition of Signal’s Gwinnett Place Ambassadors to the existing patrols by CID staff means that, for the first time, the CID will have its own 24-hour security presence that will support the efforts of the Gwinnett County Police Department in the area.

The Gwinnett Place Ambassadors are not law enforcement officers themselves, but they will patrol the area, offering directions assistance to visitors and helping business owners with non-emergency needs. They will also patrol the area to help act as a crime deterrent.

Signals patrols in the area will be coordinated with county police to promote safety and maintain security visibility.
